Ryan White Part B

Ryan White Part B services vary based on available funds and community needs assessment results. Services offered may include:

- Outpatient HIV specialty care
- Medical case management
- Oral health care
- Health insurance premium and cost sharing assistance
- Mental health services
- Medical nutrition therapy
- Food bank/home delivered meals
- Medical transportation

Ryan White Part C

Ryan White Part C services are provided on a sliding-scale fee. No one is denied services based on inability to pay. Services offered may include:

- Primary medical care
- HIV specialty care
- Mental health counseling
- Medication assistance
- Nutritional education

AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP)

The AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP) provides HIV related medications to individuals who are uninsured or do not have adequate prescription coverage.

AIDS Insurance Continuation Program (AICP)

The AIDS Insurance Continuation Program (AICP) helps individuals maintain their private insurance by assisting with insurance premiums, co-payments, and deductibles. Only individuals with AIDS or symptomatic HIV infection are eligible for assistance.



Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA)

The Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) program provides short-term payment assistance and case management to qualified individuals who are at-risk of homelessness and need assistance with rent, mortgage, and utilities. The goal of the program is to help individuals become self-sufficient.

Project AIDS Care (PAC)

The purpose of the Project AIDS Care (PAC) Medicaid Waiver Program is to promote, maintain, and optimize the health of persons living with AIDS. PAC offers services that are deemed medically necessary to prevent or delay the progression of the disease. In order to qualify for PAC, individuals must be referred by their physician.

Children's Medical Services (CMS)

CMS provides a variety of services for eligible children under the age of 21 who are infected with or have been exposed to HIV. The purpose of the program is to help promote and improve healthy lifestyles. Services may include:

- Medical evaluation and treatment
- Care coordination
- Social services
- Nutritional counseling

Prescription Assistance Program

Prescription Assistance Programs are available for medications that are not covered by any other funding source. Those in need of this service should speak with their doctor or case manager.
